4.) Referral Process

ASSES/TRIAGE

Who assess?

- We will have to develop a uniform way to assess the level of risk that each family has in order to triage their need.
- We will have to identify each point of contact in the system to train them on our risk assessment and referral process.
- Potential points of contacts: Behavioral Health Specialist, Teachers, Community Health Workers, System Navigators.

Referral Procedure:

Questions we will have to answer:

- Privacy of information
- How do we get the buy in and time commitments of the organizations in the network.
- AHCCCS will have to clearly define Care coordination and help fund this activity
- The will have to be a culture shift within providers. Shift from competition to collaboration
- Can we learn from the existing UHC MyCommunity Connects program and their electronic database and referral system called UHC MyData

5.) Community Mobilization Strategy

What will it take to EDUCATE, EMPOWER, & ACTIVATE local community members?

- We will have to research what curriculums exist that can quickly educate community members on the social determinants of health, systems thinking, leadership and civic engagement.
